# DR FW CommunityRecognition

- The five steps of Firewise recognition
  - Obtain a wildfire risk assessment as a written document from your state forestry agency or fire department.
  - Form a board or committee, and create an action plan based on the assessment.
  - Conduct a "Firewise Day" event.
  - Invest a minimum of \$2 per capita in local Firewise actions for the year.
  - Submit an application to our state Firewise liaison.
  - [Annual renewal]
- "Invest" explanation
  - For Douglass Ranch:
    - 2.5 residents/house x 42 homes x \$2 min per resident = \$210 min "investment" for Douglass Ranch
  - FW Committee maintains a summation of work of community members and FW Board (annually)
  - Purchased tools count toward "investment"
  - Example: Douglass Ranch Community Effort:
    - 5 volunteers put in 2 hours each (annually) clearing slash
    - \$23.56 x 5 x 2 = \$235.60
    - \$235 exceeds the \$210 minimum required annual "investment"
  - Use hourly rate of \$23.56 [ref: US Bureau of Labor Statistics]


